**DECISION ON
APPLICATIONS BY SKYCITY CASINO MANAGEMENT LIMITED
FOR APPROVAL OF NEW GAME MIX ANNEXES FOR THE AUCKLAND, HAMILTON,
QUEENSTOWN AND WHARF CASINOS**

Application

1. SKYCITY Casino Management Limited ("**SCML**") applied to the Commission for approval of new game mix Annexes for each of its four casinos.
2. For the Auckland casino, SCML sought approval of a new game mix Annex, pursuant to condition 9 of its operator's licence for the Auckland casino:
 - (a) which revoked Annexes A, B and C, and relabelled Annex D as Annex A;
 - (b) to deploy U-Spin on its Roulette tables and an updated automatic Dice Tumbler on its Tai Sai tables, pursuant to condition 10 of its operator's licence for the Auckland casino;
 - (c) to introduce a new dealing style, style D, on the International variation of its Baccarat tables, pursuant to condition 10 of its operator's licence for the Auckland casino;

- (d) to introduce the Buster Blackjack wagering option to its Blackjack tables and to add a progressive jackpot to its Ultimate Texas Hold'em tables, pursuant to condition 10 of its operator's licence for the Auckland casino.
3. For the Hamilton casino, SCML sought approval of a new game mix Annex, pursuant to condition 9 of its operator's licence for the Hamilton casino:
- (a) to deploy U-Spin on its Roulette tables and an updated automatic Dice Tumbler on its Tai Sai tables, pursuant to condition 10 of its operator's licence for the Hamilton casino;
 - (b) to introduce a new dealing style, style D, on the International variation of its Baccarat tables, pursuant to condition 10 of its operator's licence for the Hamilton casino;
 - (c) to operate automatic shufflers on the games of 3-Card Poker, Ultimate Texas Hold'em and Casino War, pursuant to condition 10 of its operator's licence for the Hamilton casino;
 - (d) to introduce the Buster Blackjack wagering option to its Black Jack tables and to add a progressive jackpot to its Ultimate Texas Hold'em tables, pursuant to condition 10 of its operator's licence for the Hamilton casino.
4. For the Queenstown casino, SCML sought approval of a new game mix Annex, pursuant to condition 9 of its operator's licence for the Queenstown casino:
- (a) to deploy U-Spin on its Roulette tables, pursuant to condition 10 of its operator's licence for the Queenstown casino;
 - (b) to operate automatic shufflers on the games of Baccarat and Poker, pursuant to condition 10 of its operator's licence for the Queenstown casino;
 - (c) to introduce a new dealing style, style D, on the International variation of its Baccarat tables, pursuant to condition 10 of its operator's licence for the Queenstown casino;
 - (d) to introduce the Buster Blackjack wagering option to its Blackjack tables, pursuant to condition 10 of its operator's licence for the Queenstown casino.
5. For the Wharf casino, SCML sought approval of a new game mix Annex, pursuant to condition 9 of its operator's licence for the Wharf casino:

- (a) to deploy U-Spin on its Roulette tables, pursuant to condition 10 of its operator's licence for the Wharf casino;
- (b) to operate automatic shufflers on the games of Baccarat, Poker and 3-Card Poker, pursuant to condition 10 of its operator's licence for the Wharf casino;
- (c) to introduce the Buster Blackjack wagering option to its Blackjack tables and to add a progressive jackpot to its Ultimate Texas Hold'em tables, pursuant to condition 10 of its operator's licence for the Wharf casino.

Licence conditions

6. The relevant licence conditions are as follows:

SCML operator's licence (Auckland)

- 9. The Licence Holder may operate on casino gaming tables the game types and game mix(es) specified by the Commission in Annex A attached to this Licence. As an alternative to Annex A, the Licence Holder may operate on casino gaming tables the game types and game mix(es) specified by the Commission in any additional annex approved by the Commission and attached to this Licence. The Licence Holder must give the Inspectorate prior notification before it commences operation under a different annex. The game types and game mixes specified in an annex can only be changed by the Commission.
- 10. The approval of the Commission is required prior to the use by the operator of any electronic version of the game types specified in condition 9 above or electronic aids or enhancements or changes to table game rules which create new wagering opportunities.

SCML operator's licence (Hamilton, Queenstown & Wharf)

- 9. The Licence Holder may operate on casino gaming tables the game types and game mixes specified in Annex A attached to this Licence. The Licence Holder shall obtain the prior approval of the Commission for any change to the game types and/or game mixes specified.
- 10. The approval of the Commission is required prior to the use by the operator of any electronic version of the game types specified in condition 9 above or electronic aids or enhancements or changes to table game rules which create new wagering opportunities.

Submissions by SCML

7. SCML submitted, in summary, as follows:
- (a) Pursuant to the conditions attached to the casino operator's licence for each of its casinos, Commission approval is required prior to the use of electronic aids or enhancements, or changes to table game rules which create new wagering opportunities.
 - (b) The approved game mixes are set out in an Annex, or Annexes, attached to the casino operator's licence.

- (c) It proposes making a number of changes to the Annexes at each of the casinos. The proposals are set out below.

Auckland Casino

Consolidation of Annexes

- (d) The Commission has approved game mixes set out in Annexes A, B, C and D for the Auckland Casino. While it has favoured the retention of multiple Annexes to maximise its operational flexibility, the changes incorporated in Annex D mean it is highly unlikely that SCML could ever revert to one of the earlier Annexes. In fact, Annex A reflects game mixes of 110 table games, which predates the regulatory concessions granted to SKYCITY and given effect by the New Zealand International Convention Centre Act 2013.
- (e) It proposes to revoke Annexes A, B and C, and relabel current Annex D as Annex A.

Electronic enhancements

- (f) The approved game mixes set out in revised Annex A include the games of Tai Sai and Roulette. It wants to be able to deploy electronic enhancements on these games. These enhancements are an updated automatic dice tumbler on Tai Sai and a device known as "U-Spin" on Roulette.
- (g) The game rules for Tai Sai allow dice to be tumbled either manually or electronically. Electronic dice tumblers are currently deployed but the new tumbler has a camera located within its lid to verify the dice numbers that are drawn. This change will not have any impact on the game's rate of play but it will enhance game integrity.
- (h) A U-Spin device enables players to activate the ball spin on a Roulette game using a mechanism designed for this purpose. The U-Spin equipment has been approved by the Secretary and is a novelty which is only likely to be used on one or two games. It provides for greater player participation in the game and involving players in this manner will almost certainly slow the rate of play.
- (i) Neither of these devices will increase casino gambling opportunities.

Dealing Styles – Baccarat

- (j) The revised Annex A requires at least 50% of the total number of Midi Baccarat games to be conducted in accordance with dealing style B.
- (k) The DIA recently approved a range of amendments to the Baccarat Rules including a new dealing style, style D, for deployment on the international variation of the

game. The new dealing style is a variation on dealing style B but with the added flexibility of dealing and or turning the cards in a different order. The order in which the cards are dealt or turned will have no bearing on the rate of play associated with games ordinarily dealt in style B. For rate of play purposes, the dealing styles are the same.

- (l) As it may now wish to conduct some of its Baccarat games with the new dealing style, it proposes a change to the Annex A notes to recognise that at least 50% of the total number of Midi Baccarat games shall be conducted in accordance with either dealing style B or D.

Wagering variations

- (m) A recent variation to the Blackjack rules provides for an additional wager known as Buster Blackjack. It wants to be able to introduce this wagering variation into one or more of its Blackjack games.
- (n) Similarly, following a recent variation to the rules for Ultimate Texas Hold'em, it wants to be able to introduce a progressive jackpot into this game. The progressive jackpot is modelled on a similar jackpot offering involving the Caribbean Stud Poker game.
- (o) In decision GC17/05 the Commission determined that proposed rule changes involving additional wagering options would not result in an increase in opportunities for casino gambling. In reaching that conclusion, the Commission considered the effect of the likely reductions in game speed if the wagering options were exercised.
- (p) The Commission has reached a similar conclusion in subsequent applications involving new wagering opportunities and has also noted that the utilisation of an additional wagering option may also take the place of another opportunity.
- (q) It believes that the same analysis applies to the current proposed variations. Additional wagering options are largely designed to provide players with more choice and the exercise of that choice often means that players forgo other wagering options available to them. In any event, processing additional wagers (both losing and winning), inevitably slows the rate of play on a game, and a common sense assessment would suggest that over time, the new arrangements would not lead to any overall increase in opportunities for casino gambling. It is difficult to be any more precise than that, but to the extent that the lack of precision causes any concern, it notes that the operational game mix with the highest theoretical opportunities has over 7,500 fewer opportunities than the regulatory

benchmark. The calculations in this respect were reflected in SCML's application to the Commission which was addressed in decision GC16/18.

- (r) Even if the new wagering opportunities increased casino gambling opportunities (which it does not accept) any additional opportunities would still fall well short of the regulatory benchmark.
- (s) Where the Commission has approved the use of new wagering opportunities, it has not traditionally reflected that in the game mix Annexes but rather recorded the approval in its decision. Accordingly, it is not proposing to include any notes in the revised Annex A to address this matter.

Hamilton Casino

Electronic enhancements

- (t) The approved game mixes set out in Annex A include the games of Tai Sai and Roulette. It wants to deploy the updated automatic dice tumbler on Tai Sai and the U-Spin device on Roulette. Neither of these devices will increase casino gambling opportunities for the reasons noted above.
- (u) It also wants to make changes in relation to the deployment of automatic shufflers. The notes to Annex A currently recognise that automatic shufflers may be used on Caribbean Stud Poker, Poker, Baccarat and Blackjack games for all game mixes other than game mix 1 (which provides for the more limited use of automatic shufflers). It also has approval to operate the games of 3 Card Poker, Ultimate Texas Hold'em and Casino War, the rules of which provide for the use of automatic shufflers. It can deploy automatic shufflers on these games at the Auckland Casino and is seeking a similar approval in respect of the Hamilton Casino.
- (v) The rate of play data supplied to the Commission in respect of the Auckland game mix applications involving these three games is identical to the data used in respect of the Hamilton Casino. The Auckland Annex permits the use of automatic shufflers on these games but the Hamilton Annex does not (or more accurately, it is silent on the issue).
- (w) While the use of automatic shufflers might be expected to generate some efficiencies over time allowing more games to be played, that must be balanced against the downtime associated with equipment malfunctions. In this sense any efficiencies are likely to be very minor in a rate of play context. The real value of automatic shufflers is in mitigating the risks associated with manual shufflers.

- (x) The operational game mix with the highest theoretical gambling opportunities at the Hamilton Casino represents over 1,600 fewer opportunities than the regulatory benchmark. Permitting the use of automatic shufflers on the games in question would not lead to an overall increase in casino gambling opportunities at the Hamilton Casino.

Dealing Styles – Baccarat

- (y) Annex A currently requires at least 50% of the total number of Midi Baccarat games to be conducted in accordance with dealing style B. Following rule changes, which provide for a new dealing style, style D on the international variation of the game, it seeks a variation to the Annex notes to recognise that at least 50% of the total number of Midi Baccarat games shall be conducted in accordance with either style B or D.

Wagering variations

- (z) Following the recent variations to the game rules, it seeks the flexibility to deploy Buster Blackjack on Blackjack and a Progressive jackpot on Ultimate Texas Hold'em.

Queenstown Casino

Electronic enhancements

- (aa) The approved game mixes set out in Annex A include the game of Roulette. It seeks the option of deploying the U-Spin device on its Roulette tables and as noted above, this will not impact on the rate of play.
- (bb) The notes to Annex A currently recognise that automatic shufflers may be used on Caribbean Stud Poker and on all Blackjack tables for all game mixes other than game mix 1 (which provides for the more limited use of automatic shufflers). It also has approval to operate automatic shuffling equipment on the games of Baccarat and Poker at both Auckland and Hamilton Casinos and it is seeking a similar approval in respect of the Queenstown Casino, to ensure consistency.
- (cc) The rate of play data supplied to the Commission in respect of Baccarat and Poker games at Auckland and Hamilton in respect of previous game mix applications is the same as that used for Queenstown. And yet the Auckland and Hamilton Annexes permit the use of automatic shufflers on these games whereas the Queenstown Annex does not (or more accurately, it is silent on the issue). While the use of automatic shufflers might be expected to generate some efficiencies over time allowing more games to be played, that must be balanced against the downtime

associated with equipment malfunctions. In this sense any efficiencies are likely to be very minor in a rate of play context. The real value of automatic shufflers is in mitigating the risks associated with manual shufflers.

- (dd) The operational game mix with the highest theoretical gambling opportunities at the Queenstown Casino represents over 275 fewer opportunities than the regulatory benchmark. Permitting the use of automatic shufflers on the games in question would not lead to an overall increase in casino gambling opportunities at the Queenstown Casino.

Dealing Style – Baccarat

- (ee) Annex A currently specifies that all Midi Baccarat games in the further alternative game mixes and operating in the Horizon Room shall be conducted in accordance with dealing style B. Following the recent rule changes which permit a new dealing style, style D, on the international variation of the game, it proposes to revise the notes to Annex A to recognise that either dealing style B or dealing style D may be used.

Wagering variation

- (ff) Following the recent variation to game rules, it seeks flexibility to introduce Buster Blackjack on one or more Blackjack games at the Queenstown casino.

Wharf Casino

Electronic enhancements

- (gg) The approved game mixes set out in Annex A include the game of Roulette. It seeks the option to deploy the U-Spin device on Roulette and as noted above, this will not impact the rate of play.
- (hh) Annex A currently permits automatic shufflers to be used on Caribbean Stud Poker, Lunar Poker and any Blackjack table. For consistency with game mixes at its other properties, it is proposing to extend the games on which automatic shufflers may be used to include Baccarat, Poker and 3 Card Poker games.

Wagering variations

- (ii) Its approved game mixes include the games of Blackjack and Ultimate Texas Hold'em. Following the recent variations to the game rules, it seeks the flexibility to introduce Buster Blackjack on its Blackjack tables and a Progressive jackpot on Ultimate Texas Hold'em at the Wharf Casino.

Submissions by the Secretary

8. In his submissions, the Secretary noted that game rules restrict dealing style D to use only on the International variation of Baccarat. Otherwise he had no regulatory concerns with any of the proposals and was satisfied that the proposed Annexes would not increase opportunities at any of the four casinos.

SCML's submissions in reply

9. In reply, SCML concurred that dealing style D may be used only on the International version of Baccarat. It submitted that the notes at the foot of the game mix Annex would not override the game rules, but if there is a view that the Annex notes should better reflect the restrictions contained in the rules, it is comfortable with the appropriate note being amended to provide as follows:

At least 50% of the total number of Midi Baccarat games shall be conducted in accordance with dealing style B or (where permitted by the Baccarat Rules) dealing style D.

Analysis

10. SCML sought Commission approval for new game mix Annexes for each of its four casinos.

Auckland casino

11. In relation to the Auckland casino, SCML sought approval:
- (a) to consolidate its game mix Annexes into a single Annex;
 - (b) to introduce an updated automatic Dice Tumbler to its Tai Sai tables;
 - (c) to introduce U-Spin to its Roulette tables;
 - (d) to introduce dealing style D to the International version of its Baccarat tables;
 - (e) to introduce the Buster Blackjack wagering option to its Black Jack tables; and
 - (f) to introduce a progressive jackpot wagering option to its Ultimate Texas Hold'em tables.

Consolidation of game mixes

12. While SCML's application to consolidate its multiple game mix Annexes into a single Annex raised no issues of regulatory concern for the Commission, it asked SCML whether it had considered all potential implications of removing the original benchmark game mix for the Auckland casino as at 19 September 2003. The increase in the casino size and operation authorised by the NZICC Act 2013 arises independently of the Gambling Act and is not a permanent change to the Auckland casino, with a fixed expiration and being subject, in the interim, to the terms of the NZICC Agreement. The Commission pointed out that the 110 table benchmark mix, based on 2003 position, is intended to preserve the position under the

Gambling Act 2003, maintaining opportunity at the original level and avoiding inadvertent loss of opportunity arising as a consequence of the statutory prohibition on increases.

13. After considering the Commission's query and observations, SCML amended the proposed Annex to retain the 2003 benchmark mix.

Electronic enhancements

14. SCML sought approval to introduce an updated Dice Tumbler to the game of Tai Sai and to add the U-Spin device to the game of Roulette. In order to understand the implications of SCML's proposals, the Commission, through its Executive Director, attended a live demonstration of U-Spin in use on a Roulette table, and the updated Dice Tumbler in use on a Tai Sai table. The Executive Director participated in mock games in a training room at the Auckland casino, including deploying the U-Spin device as part of the Roulette games.
15. The Commission was satisfied that the introduction of the updated Dice Tumbler would have no bearing on casino gambling opportunities on Tai Sai as the only difference between the old tumbler and the proposed new tumbler is the presence of a camera on the inside of the new tumbler's lid. The camera will not impact upon the speed of the game, but will have significant integrity benefits in that it will record exactly what numbers are depicted on the dice, thereby eliminating human error or deliberate cheating by the dealer.
16. The U-Spin device was approved for use in New Zealand by the Department of Internal Affairs on 27 August 2018, but the DIA's approval alone is insufficient to permit SCML to deploy the device; each casino, including the Auckland casino, has a condition attached to its operator's licence which requires the operator to obtain Commission approval "prior to the use by the operator of any ... electronic aids or enhancements."
17. U-Spin is clearly "an electronic aid or enhancement" so SCML was required to seek Commission approval, pursuant to condition 10 of its operator's licence, before deploying U-Spin at its casinos.
18. Condition 10 was intended to ensure that increases in opportunity would not occur as a result of subsequent changes in rules or technology which were not considered by the Commission when it approved existing game mixes. It allows the Secretary to approve changes to game rules and the use of technology without having to be concerned about consequent increases in opportunities for casino gambling in breach of section 11 of the Act. Applications under condition 10 require the Commission to consider whether the introduction of the change, being a new electronic aid or enhancement, has the potential to increase the speed of a casino game and, therefore, to increase opportunities for casino gambling.

19. SCML submitted that U-Spin would not increase opportunities and would probably reduce the speed of a Roulette table, given the increased player involvement in the game. In addition to viewing the U-Spin in action, the Commission also viewed a video clip which demonstrated the U-Spin device in operation on a Roulette wheel.
20. The Commission considered the information relayed to it by its Executive Director, the video and the submissions made by SCML and the Secretary. The Commission was satisfied that the deployment of a U-Spin device on the Roulette tables would not increase the speed of Roulette and would not increase casino gambling opportunities.

Dealing Style D

21. The DIA has recently amended the game rules for Baccarat to allow for the deployment of a new dealing style, style D. SCML's proposal is for at least 50% of the total number of Midi Baccarat games to be conducted in accordance with dealing style B or D, with style D being used only on the International version of the game. As dealing style D is new to the Commission, its Executive Director attended a demonstration of its use on a Baccarat table at a training room at the Auckland casino. The Executive Director relayed his findings to the Commission.
22. The Commission considered the information relayed to it by its Executive Director, together with the submissions made by SCML and the Secretary.
23. The Commission was satisfied that the introduction of dealing style D would not increase the speed of game play compared to dealing style B and that allowing their substitution would not increase opportunities for casino gambling.
24. In his submissions, the Secretary noted that style D can only be deployed on the International version of Baccarat. SCML acknowledged the limitation in its reply submissions and, in order to make the position clearer, it proposed to amend the notes attached to its game mix Annex to provide that dealing style D can only be utilised where game rules permit its use.
25. The Commission agreed that, for clarity, the note proposed by SCML should be added to the game mix Annex. It amended the Annex accordingly.

Wagering variations

26. SCML sought approval to introduce an additional wagering option to both Blackjack and Ultimate Texas Hold'em and submitted that doing so would not increase opportunities for casino gambling at either game.

27. The Commission has previously considered whether the introduction of new wagering options increase opportunities for casino gambling. It did so first in decision GC17/05, which was a referral to the Commission by the Secretary. The Secretary was concerned that, if he made Rule changes to introduce new wagering options to Baccarat and Pontoon, he might be in breach section 11 of the Act by increasing opportunities for casino gambling. The Commission determined, by a 3:2 majority, that the introduction of the proposed new options would not increase casino gambling opportunities as the effect of introducing the new wagering options would likely be offset by a reduction in the speed of the games to process those options, should patrons utilise them.
28. The Commission's decision was specific to the details of the Secretary's referral. The decision does not have broad application to, nor create a precedent for, other applications to introduce new wagering options to table games. In fact, Decision GC17/05 resulted in the addition of condition 10 to all casino operator's licences. The purpose of condition 10 was to allow the Secretary to approve new game rules without fear of breaching section 11, while ensuring that deployment of changes would remain controlled by the Commission's prior assessment of their potential effect, having regard to section 11 of the Act.
29. In relation to the current proposals, the Commission considered whether the introduction of Buster Blackjack to Blackjack and the progressive jackpot to Ultimate Texas Hold'em would increase opportunities for casino gambling. The Commission was satisfied that they would not; in the Commission's view, the effect of utilising the new wagering option would likely be a reduction in game speed which at least matched the additional opportunity to wager.

The other casinos

30. SCML sought approval of new game mix Annexes at the other casinos which included one or more of the proposed Auckland changes outlined above. In addition, SCML sought approval:
- (a) at the Hamilton casino, to operate automatic shufflers on games of 3-Card Poker, Ultimate Texas Hold'em and Casino War;
 - (b) at the Queenstown casino, to operate automatic shufflers on games of Baccarat and Poker; and
 - (c) at the Wharf casino, to operate automatic shufflers on the games of Baccarat, Poker and 3-Card Poker.
31. SCML's submissions relied on calculations based on test data from testing conducted at Auckland casino many years ago. In Decision GC17/10, the Commission recorded serious misgivings about the test data and their use in extensive opportunity calculations. It has

declined to endorse or adopt such calculations in the past and does so again. To be useful, the data quality issues identified would need to be substantially improved.

32. In the case of the changes proposed for Auckland and repeated at the other casinos, approval has been a straightforward assessment of the likelihood of the changes increasing gambling opportunities. As the Commission considers that their utilisation will not increase opportunities for casino gambling, the proposed changes are approved.
33. The remaining proposed changes related to the deployment of automatic shufflers on certain games at the Hamilton, Queenstown and Wharf casinos. The position is less clear-cut as automatic shufflers are known to increase game speed. Importantly, however, the proposed increased provision for the use of automatic shufflers in those casinos does not extend to the regulatory benchmarks at each casino (the game mix reflecting September 2003 utilisation).
34. The Commission has previously permitted the unrestricted use of automatic shufflers in other game mixes at Auckland on the basis that it was satisfied, in the round, that the differences in opportunities between those game mixes and the regulatory benchmark was sufficiently substantial that the increase in speed afforded by the use of automatic shufflers was offset by those differences.
35. The Commission reached a similar conclusion with the proposed changes at Hamilton, Queenstown and Wharf casinos. The proposed changes do not include the regulatory benchmark mix and the Commission is satisfied that permitting more extensive use of automatic shufflers in the other game mixes will not result in an increase in the opportunities for casino gambling compared to the regulatory benchmark mix.

Decision

36. The Commission:
 - (a) approved the new game mix Annex (**attached**) for the Auckland casino, pursuant to conditions 9 and 10 of SCML's operator's licence for the Auckland casino;
 - (b) approved the new game mix Annex (**attached**) for the Hamilton casino, pursuant to conditions 9 and 10 of SCML's operator's licence for the Hamilton casino;
 - (c) approved the new game mix Annex (**attached**) for the Queenstown casino, pursuant to conditions 9 and 10 of SCML's operator's licence for the Queenstown casino; and
 - (d) approved the new game mix Annex (**attached**) for the Wharf casino, pursuant to conditions 9 and 10 of SCML's operator's licence for the Wharf casino.

Right of appeal

37. Pursuant to section 235 of the Act, a person affected by this decision may appeal that decision to the High Court. An appeal must be made within 15 working days of the date of notice of the Commission's decision, or any longer period that the High Court may allow.
